Artwork

The artistic workshops were conducted in Targoviste on 16-18 June, in Radauti on 21-22 June and in Brasov on 23 of June. They involved 28 students in each school. The workshops were interactive and built on the previous artistic classroom exercises done by the students. The artist, Mario Leonte, first discussed his approach with the schools' art teachers and then held consultations with the students on how the final piece of art should be realised. The method finally chosen was a design printed on glass.

During the workshops, the students learned how to scan their drawings and transform them in corell draw and how to re-organise the drawings including the text of the Charter, so that it could be transposed for the cater plotter. They saw how the cater plotter cuts the drawings and made the print-outs that were then put on glass by professional workers.

The students in Brasov learned to transpose their drawings in a bigger scale onto a wall and how to prepare and use the washable paints for external use. They were supported in their artistic work by the school's art teacher.

Two glass walls were erected in Romania and one wall was painted;

Inauguration

The inauguration of the art works took place on 30 September in Radauti, on 1 October in Targoviste and on 29 October in Brasov.

The art work in Radauti was put on the façade of the School "Regina Elisabeta", located in downtown Radauti, on a much frequented main street.

The art work in Targoviste was built on the central square of the town, between the Art Museum, Police Museum and Museum of History.

The art work in Brasov was put on the façade of the ARO Hotel, in the middle of the down town area.

In Romania, 78 schools participated, involving 231 teachers and 5,231 students. One additional school was accepted, which did not receive the material but worked on the basis of PDF files and created an excellent result.
